orthodontic evaluation?

Early evaluation allows for the timely detection of orthodontic problems. In turn, it provides an



opportunity for more effective treatment. Prudent intervention guides growth and development to prevent serious problems later. The American Association of Orthodontists recommends that all

children receive an initial orthodontic evaluation at the first sign of orthodontic problems or no later than age 7. At this early age, orthodontic treatment may not be necessary. We will encourage patients to return periodically (every 6-12 months) at no fee to observe" and monitor dental development.

What are Observation Visits?



What are Orthodontic Records? Orthodontic records consist of models/casts

and digital radiographs/photographs of the teeth and face. These assist us in formulating an individualized treatment plan for each patient. This plan will be discussed at the Treatment Plan Conference.

When is the best time to begin orthodontic treatment?

After reviewing the orthodontic records and making a treatment plan, we will discuss the optimal timing for your

individual treatment needs. No two patients are exactly alike.

How long does treatment take?

Each patient's treatment is unique. However, patients generally wear braces less than two years. A variety of factors determine treatment time, such as the severity of the problem being corrected and how well the patient follows the treatment instructions. Once the braces are removed, patients wear retainers to keep their teeth in their new positions.
